Freedom of Information Request

We are writing in response to your Freedom of Information request. Your request has been considered in accordance with the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act and our information access policy.

You asked for the following information:

"Under the Freedom of Information Act can you please tell me how many staff in total that Transport for Wales employs and out of these staff how many of them are Welsh speakers."

Having reviewed your questions, we are able to provide the following information:

The total staff headcount of Transport for Wales (the not-for-profit subsidiary company wholly owned by Welsh Government) is 534 as of today's date. Please note that this headcount grows on a weekly basis.

In relation to the number of Welsh-speaking staff; currently, this information is provided by staff on a voluntary basis only, whilst we do not hold this information in a reportable way on our systems. Work is currently ongoing to address this by updating our HR system to contain an updatable field, which all staff will be asked to complete by the end September 2021. Though this information is unavailable at the current time, it is likely that we will be able to provide this information from mid-October 2021 onwards if it were to be requested.

[Please note: Information pertaining to Transport for Wales Rail Limited (the Welsh Government's 'Operator of Last Resort' established in February 2021 to take over day-to-day management of the Welsh and Boarders franchise from KeolisAmey) has not been included here, as it was not requested.]

We hope this information is of use to you.
