What is the Wales National Travel Survey?

The Wales National Travel Survey (WNTS) is an ongoing annual survey aimed at helping us understand how people use and experience transport across Wales. Around 15,000 households are invited to participate annually, and results will be published on TfW's website.

Who are the National Centre for Social Research (NatCen)?

NatCen is Britain's largest independent social research agency. For over 50 years, they have worked with charities, government and academic institutions. They are independent of all government departments and political parties.

Why is the study important?

The WNTS is your chance to tell us about your experiences, opinions and use of all forms of transport in Wales. We value your contribution as we want to hear from people of different genders, ages and all walks of life, living in all parts of Wales.

Why should I take part?

Participation is voluntary, but your answers will help us to understand and take action on things that are important to you. The survey will take about 40 minutes and you will receive a £10 Love2Shop voucher as a thank you.

How did you get my contact details?

Your address was randomly selected from the Royal Mail's publicly-available list of all addresses in Wales.

Can I take part in Welsh?

Yes. You can participate in this survey in Welsh or English.

Are my answers kept confidential?

Yes. The information you give us will be kept confidential and only used for research purposes. More details about the survey and how we store and process your information can be found on our website.
