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Welcome on board

This is an overview of our current and future fleet of trains, detailing the facilities available on board for people with reduced mobility and for cyclists. We are in the process of introducing our new fleet of trains and this document will be updated when trains are refurbished or withdrawn.

Assistance during your journey

Wheelchairs and Mobility Scooters

You can bring your wheelchair and mobility scooter on board our trains, provided they meet the size and weight requirements.

- dimensions of up to 700mm x 1200mm (including footplates);
- a turning radius of 900mm; and
- a maximum combined weight (wheelchair and passenger) of 300kg.

Built in 1987, Class 150s are two carriage diesel trains.
We have 19 in our fleet.



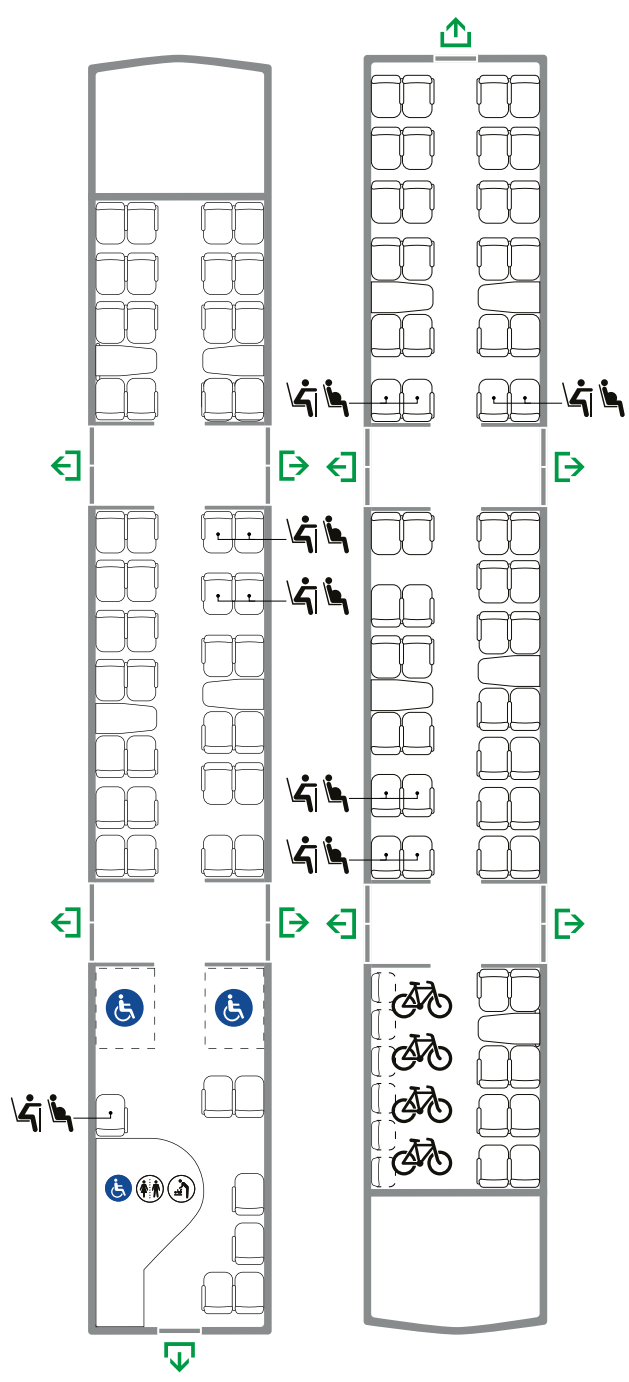

Class 153

Built between 1987 and 1988, Class 153s are single carriage diesel trains which are coupled as pairs.

We have 3 types of unit in service which are coupled as follows:

- Class 153/3 with Class 153/5 (Active Travel). We have 6 in our fleet.
Heart of Wales line only.
- Class 153/3 with Class 153/9. We have 17 in our fleet.



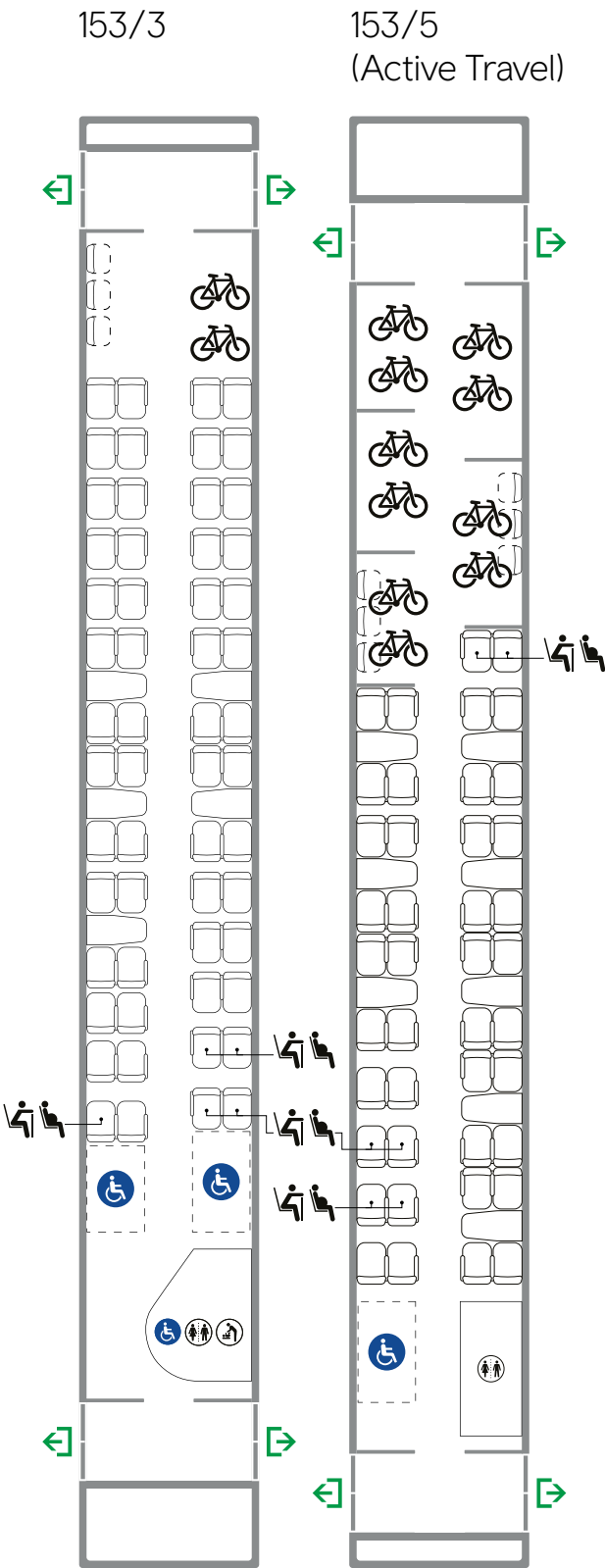

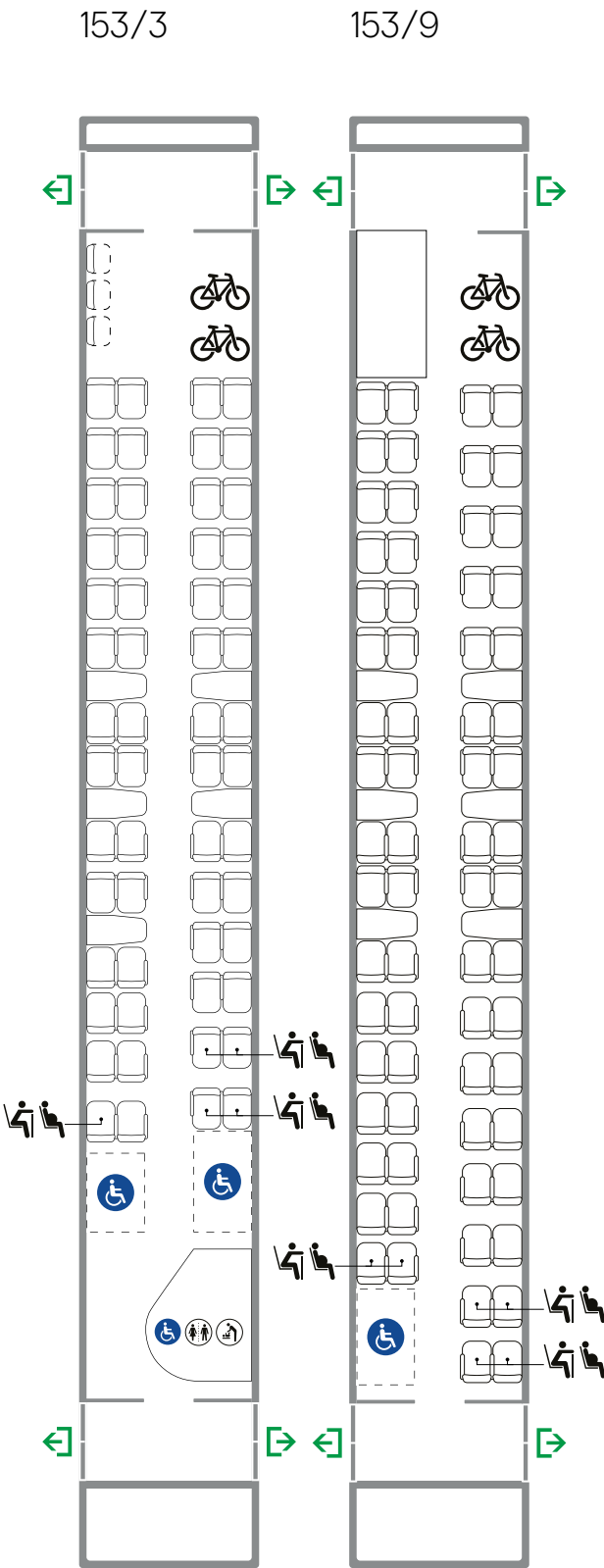

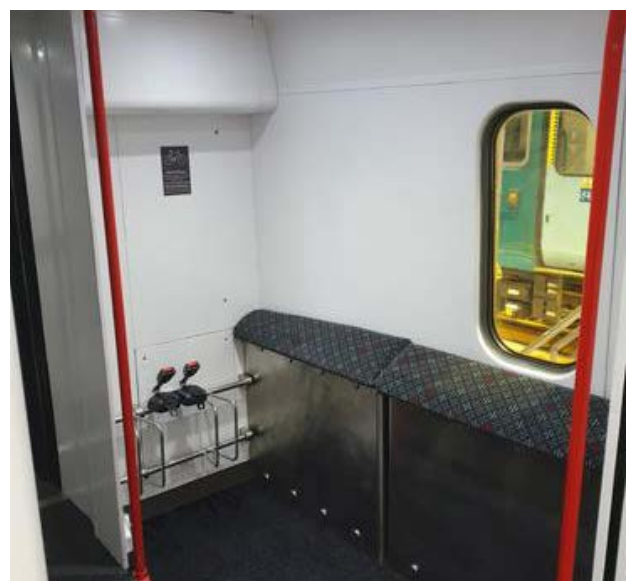

Built between 1989 and 1992, Class 158s are two carriage diesel trains. We have 22 in our fleet.

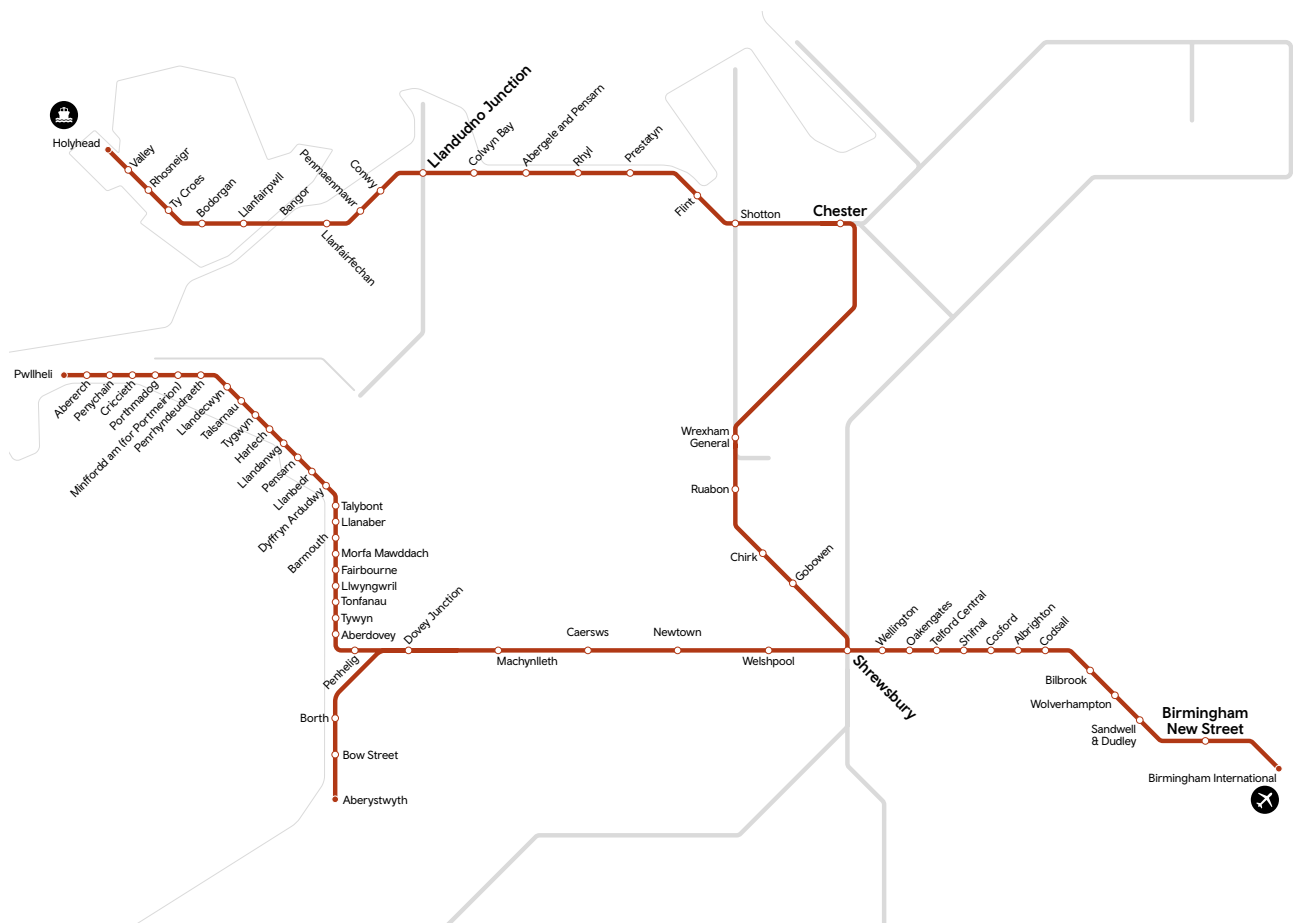
Class 158s have a smaller universal accessible toilet and limited room to manoeuvre a wheelchair.



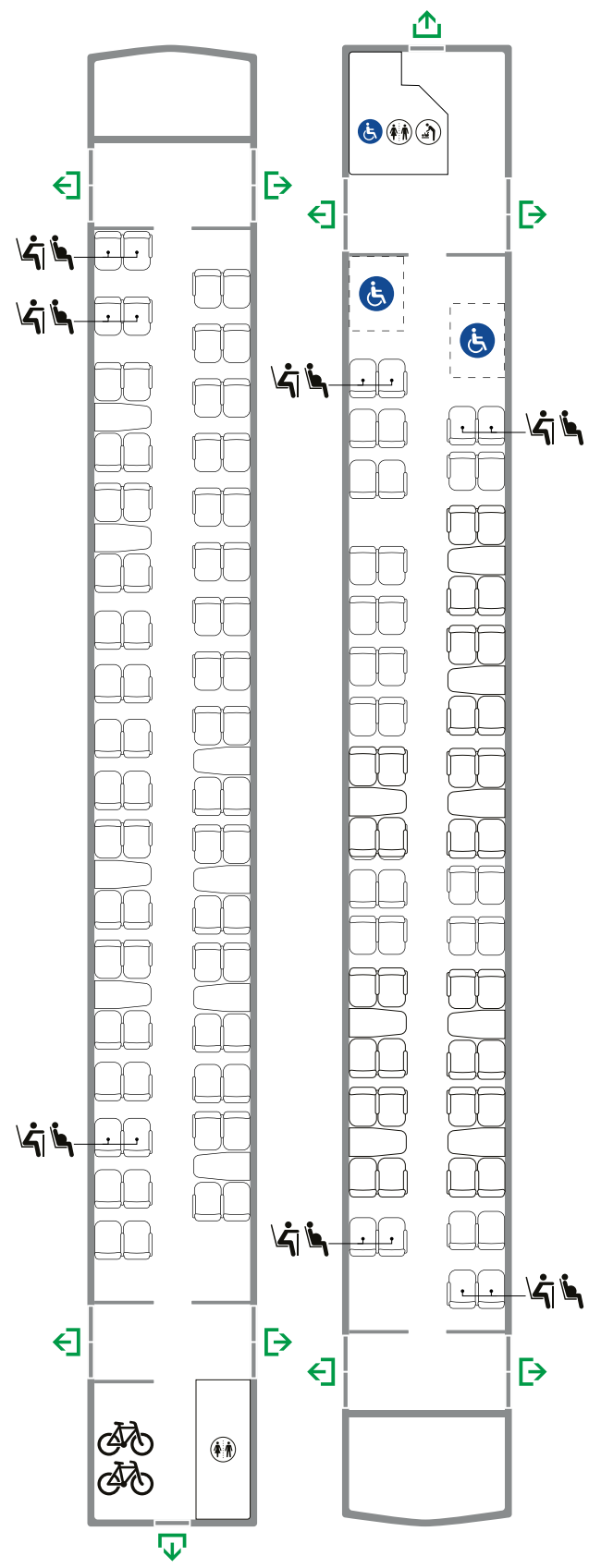

Mark 4 Coach

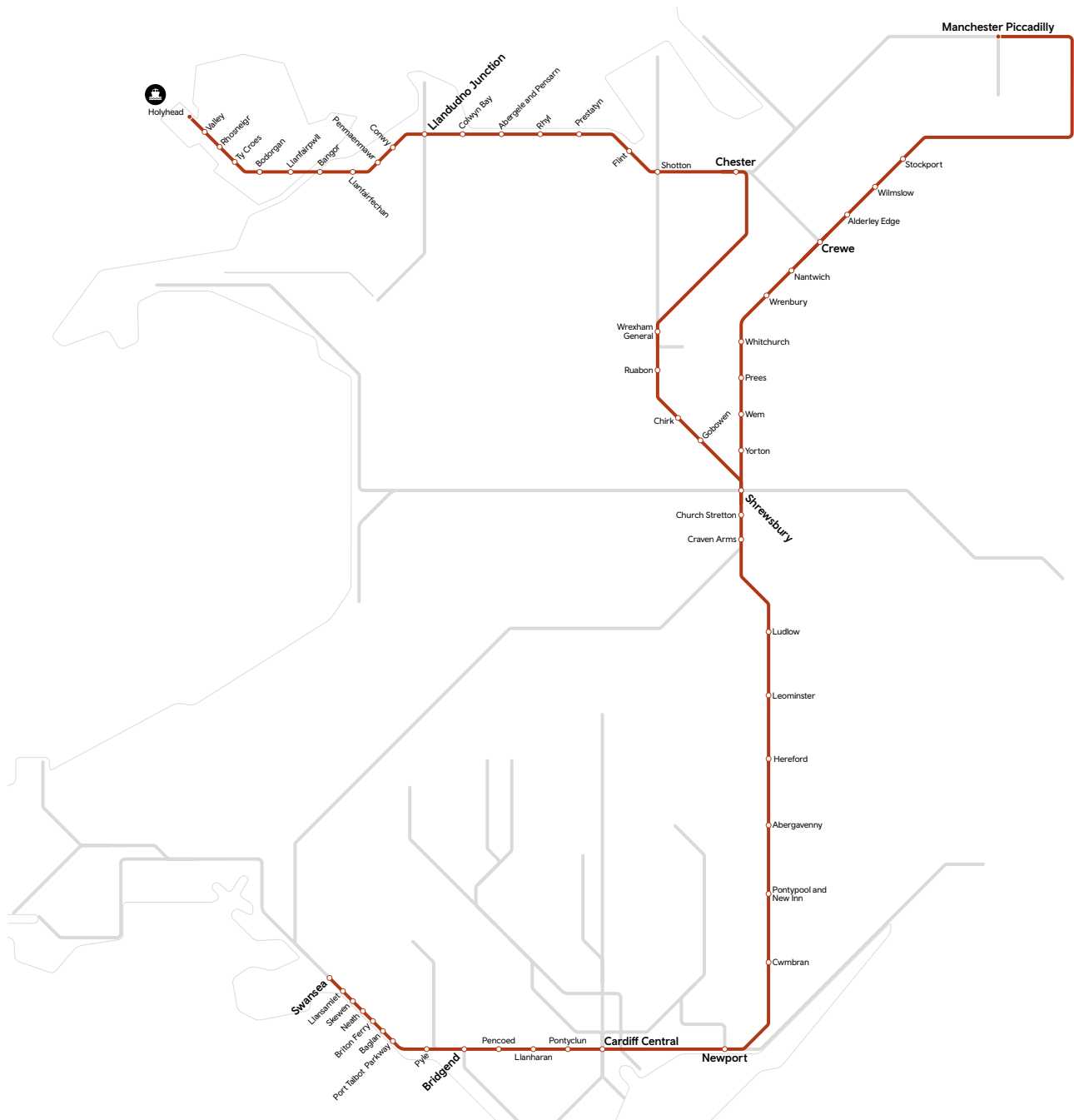
Built between 1989 and 1992, Mark 4 Coaches are locomotive-hauled coaches. We have seven trains of five coaches in our fleet.



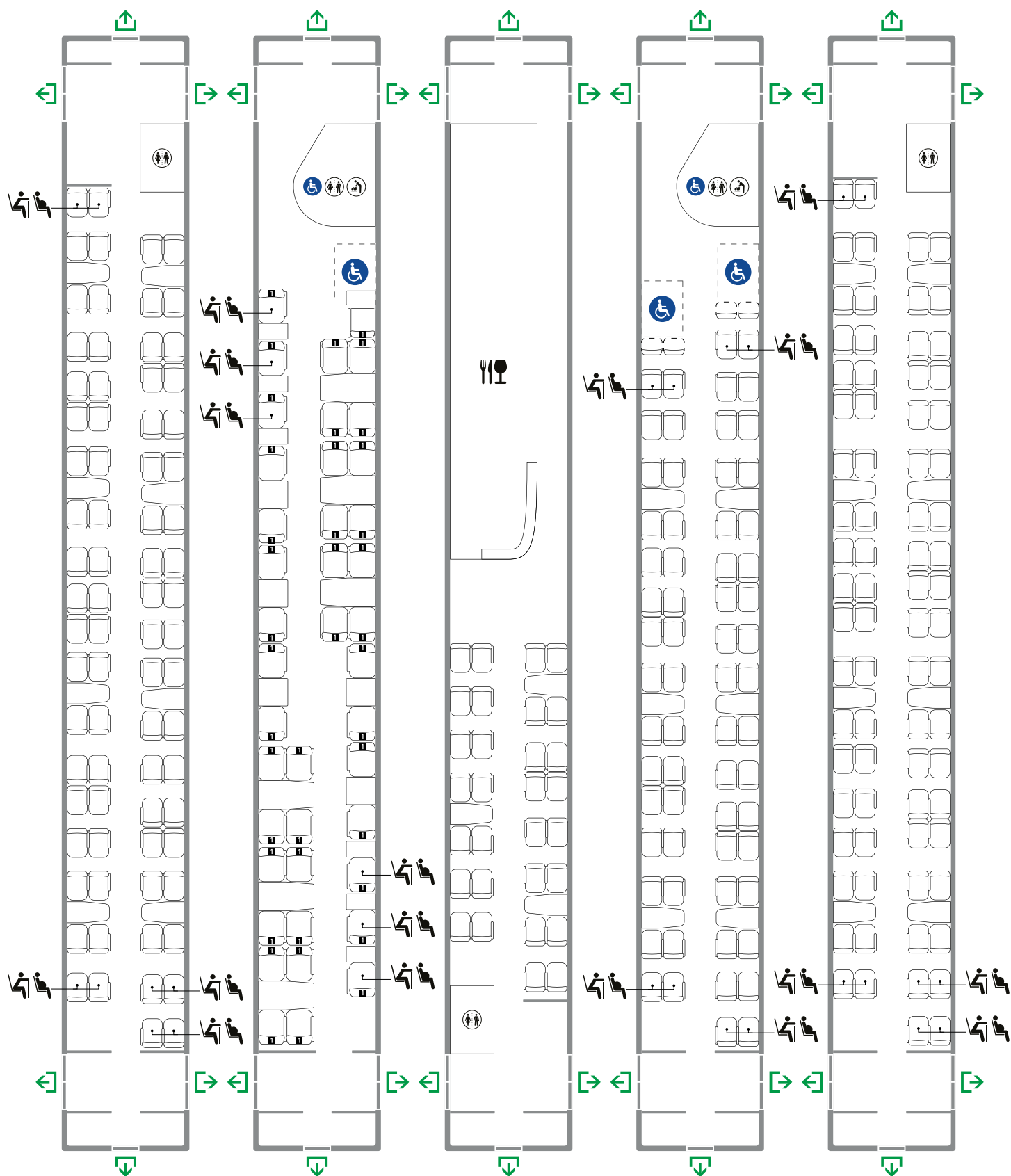

Class 230

Class 230 is a new concept of Diesel, Battery and Battery Hybrid Electric Multiple Unit (BHMU) train. Repurposed in 2019 -2021 from London Underground's (LUL's) D78 stock trains.



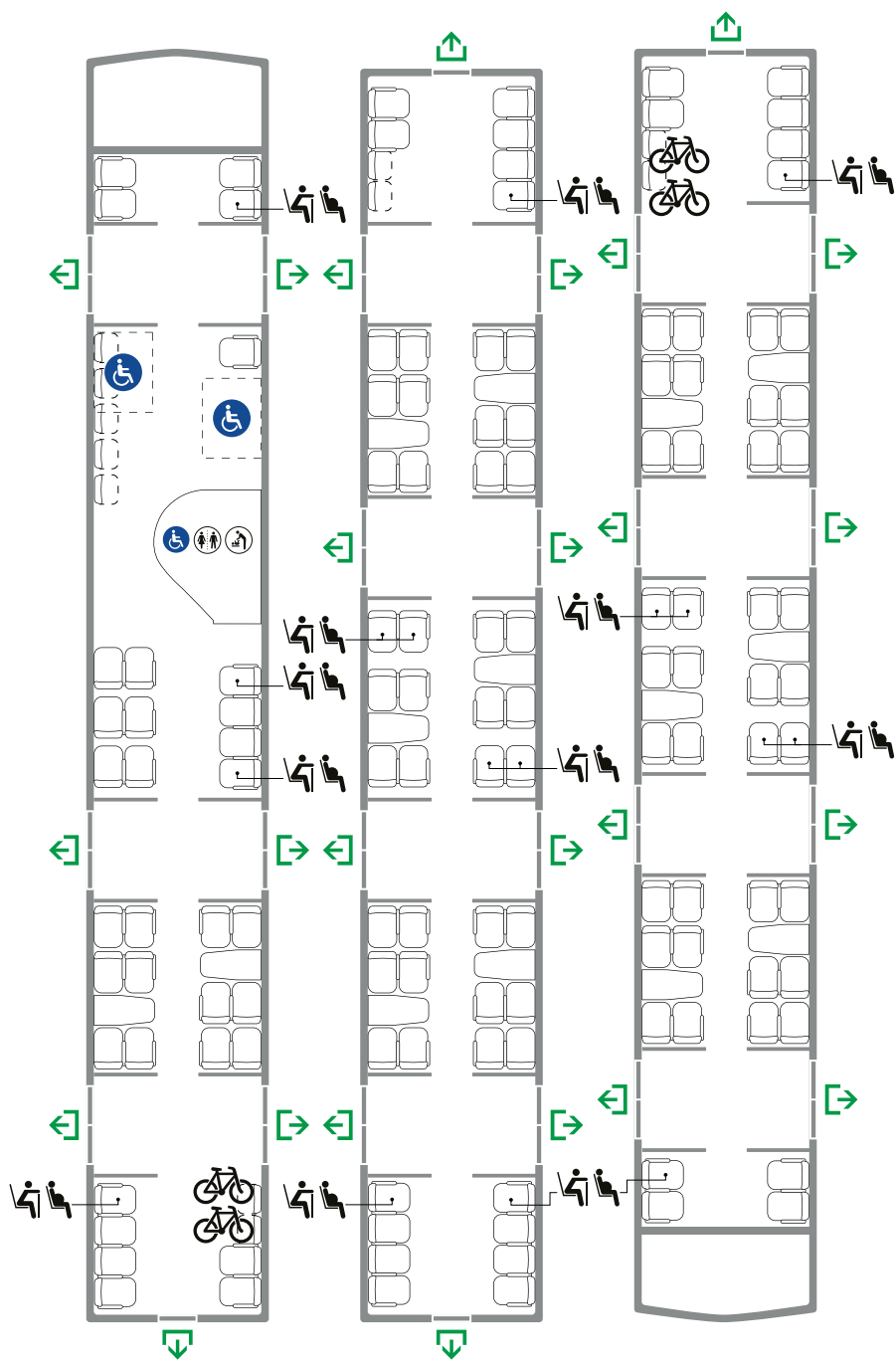

Class 197

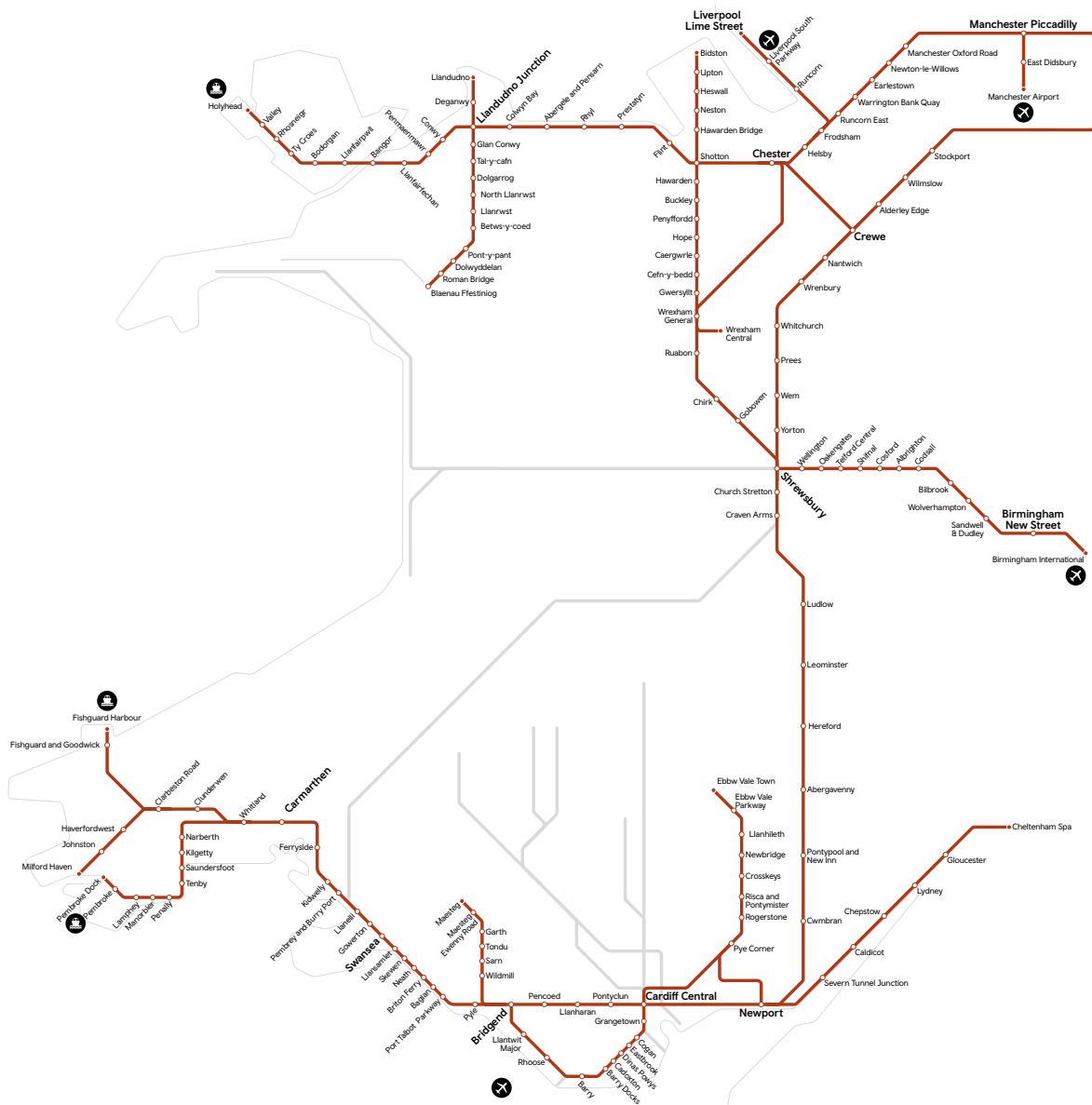
Built between 2020 and the present, Class 197s are two and three carriage diesel trains. We have 77 in our fleet - 51 with two carriages and 26 with three carriages.

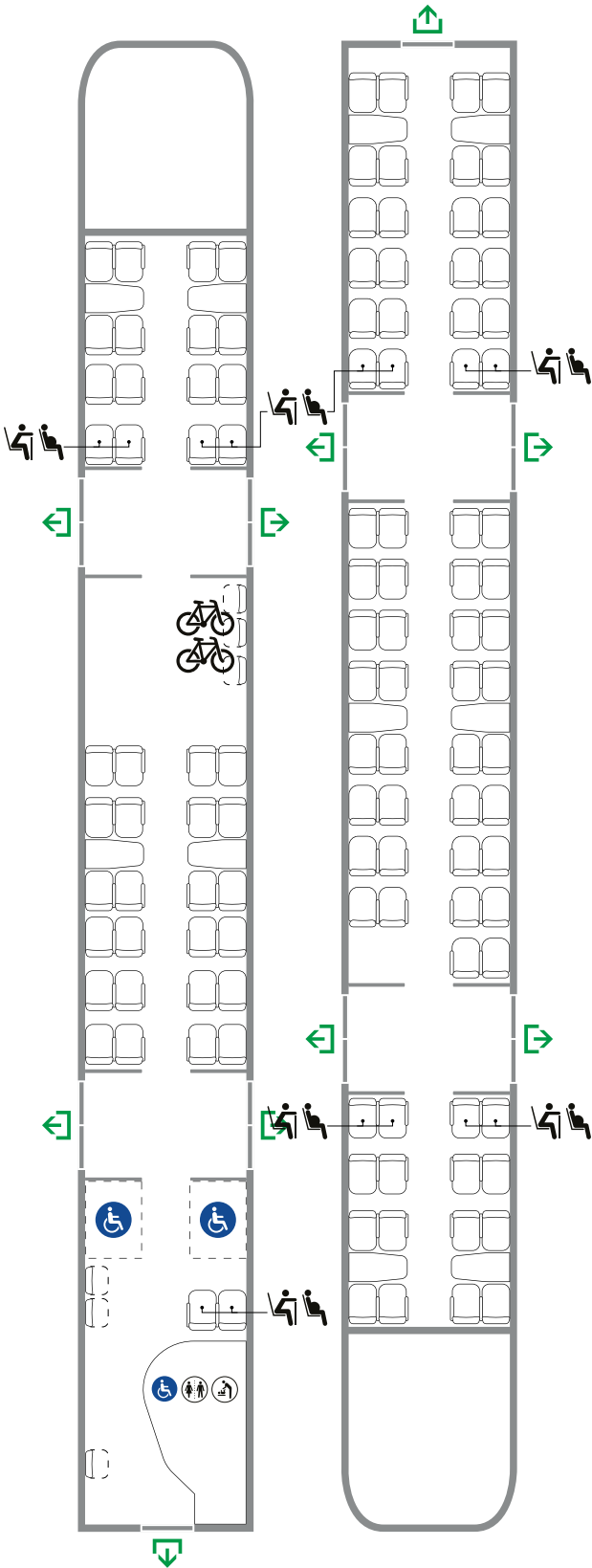
These are the most common routes where you'll find Class 197 trains.

- Cardiff to Carmarthen, Ebbw Vale and Bridgend (Via Vale of Glamorgan)
- Carmarthen to Milford Haven, Fishguard Harbour and Pembroke Dock
- Chester to Manchester Airport (via Frodham), Liverpool Lime St, Shrewsbury (via Crewe), Shrewsbury (via Wrexham) and Holyhead
- Crewe to Manchester Piccadilly (via Wilmslow)
- Llandudno to Blaenau Ffestiniog
- Cardiff to Cheltenham Spa
- Shrewsbury to Birmingham and Cardiff
- Wrexham Central to Bidston To support when 230s are not available

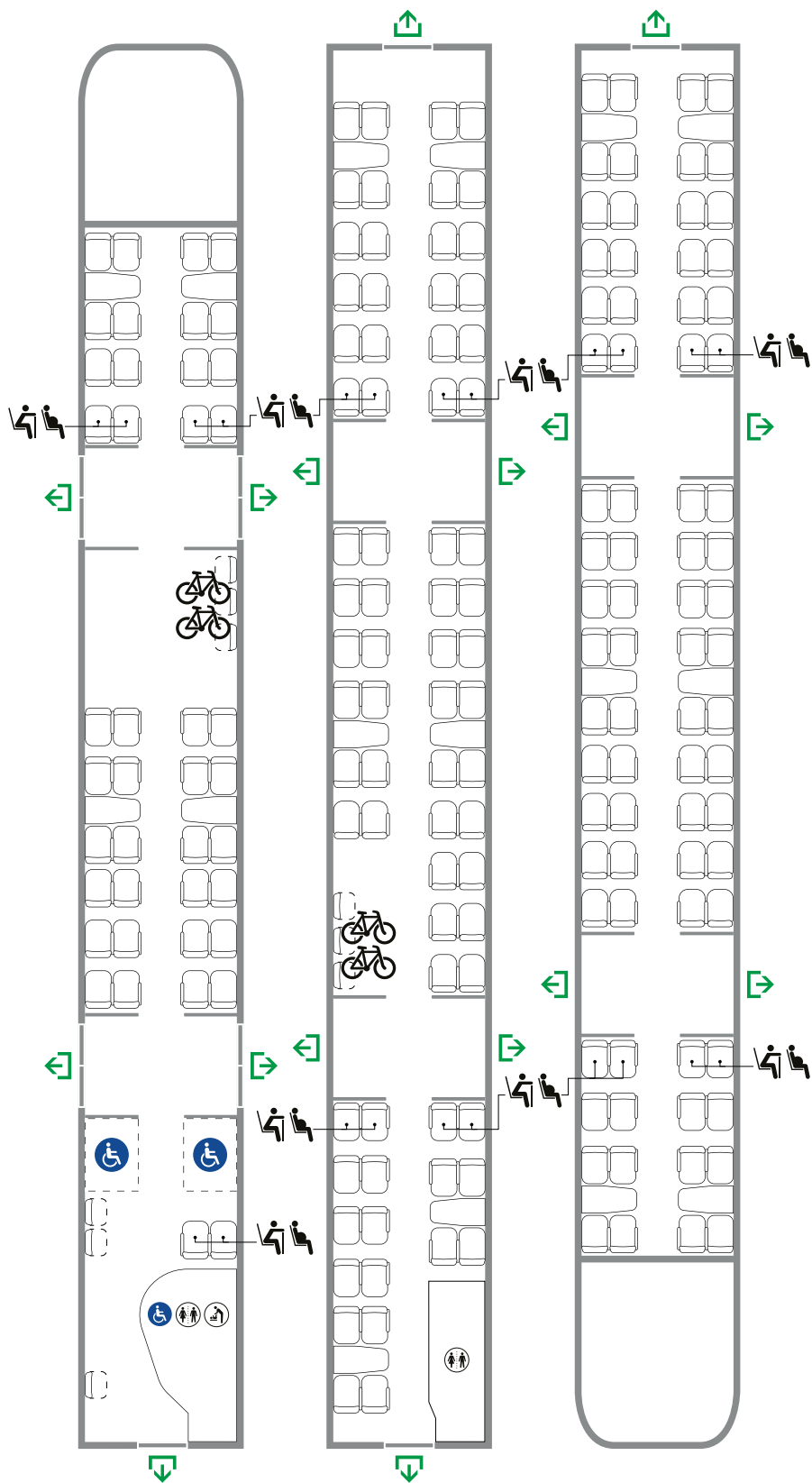

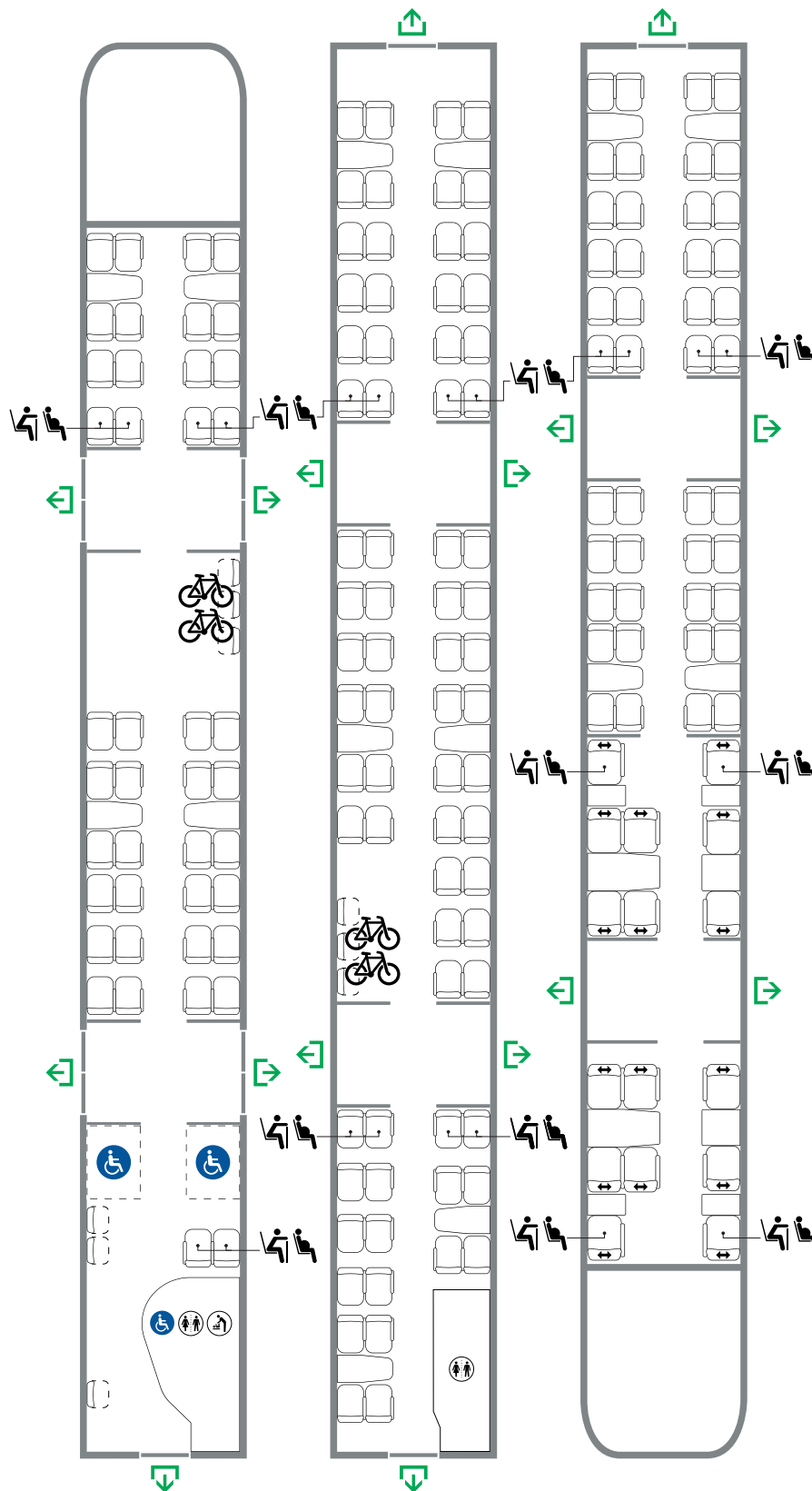

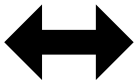

Built between 2020 and the present, Class 231s are four carriage diesel trains. We have 11 in our fleet.



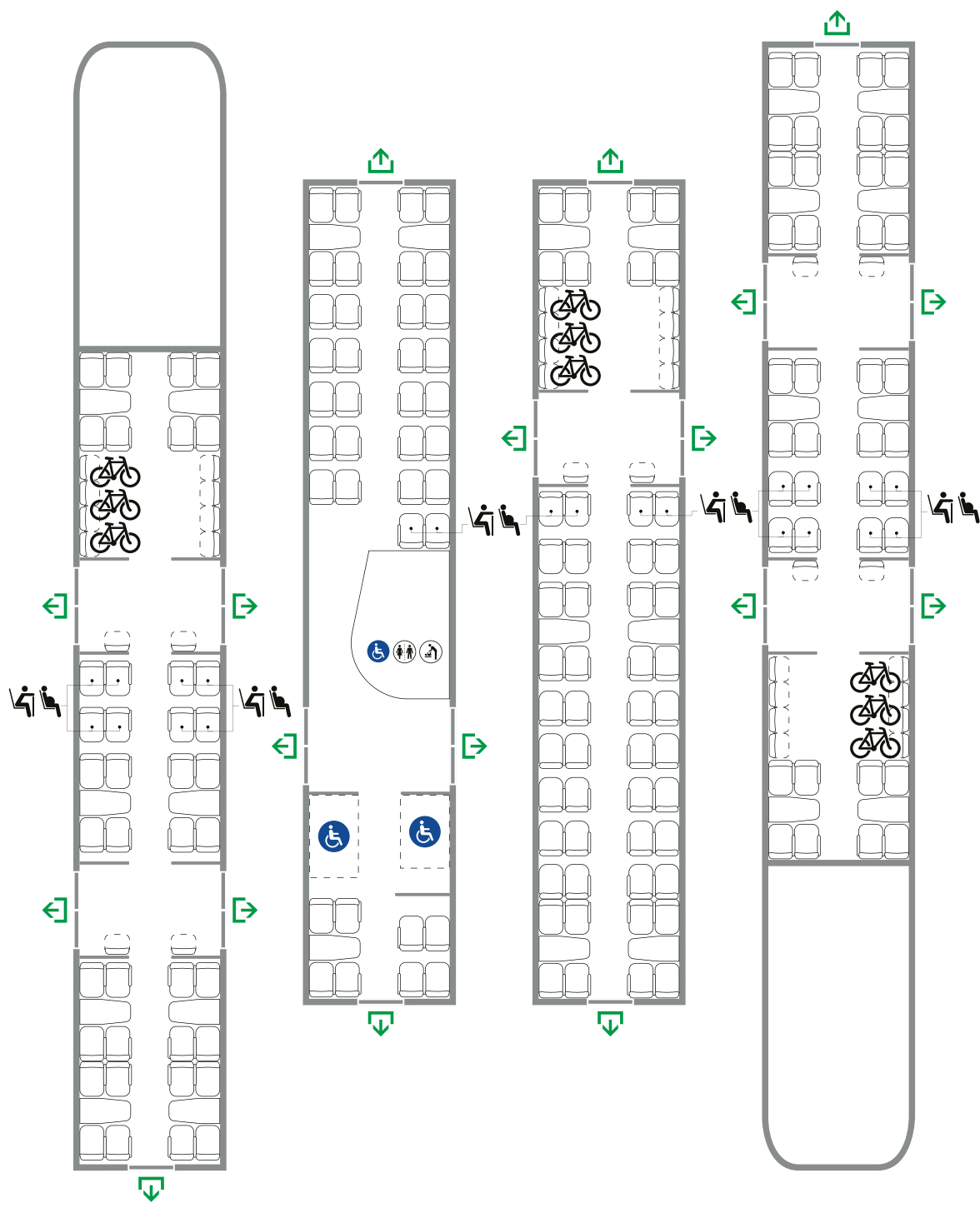

Class 756 Flirt

Built between 2020 and the present, Class 756 Flirts are three and four carriage trimode trains using diesel, electricity and battery.

We have 24 of these brand new trains in our fleet in total - seven with three carriages and 17 with four carriages.

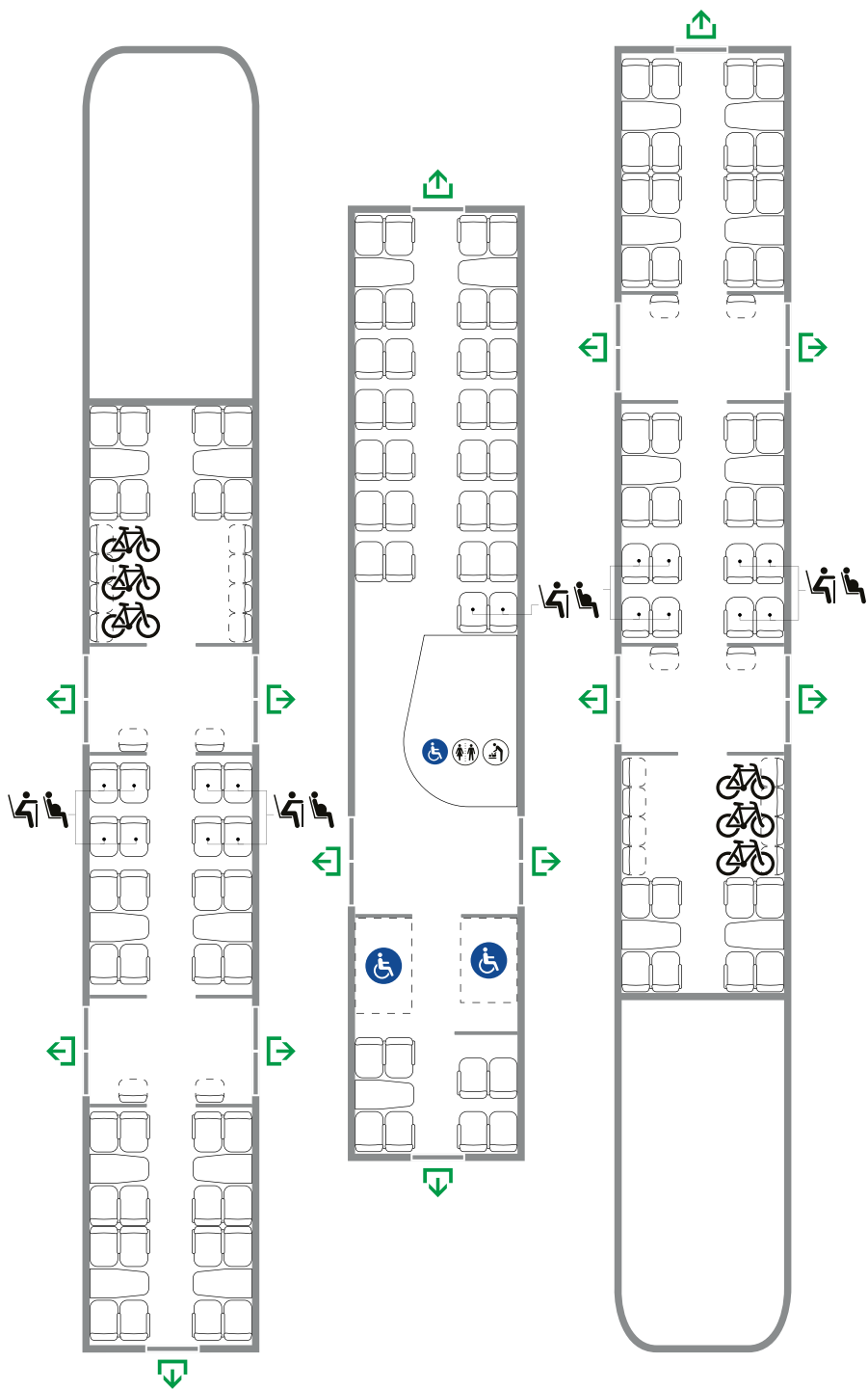
These are the most common routes where you'll find Class 756 trains.

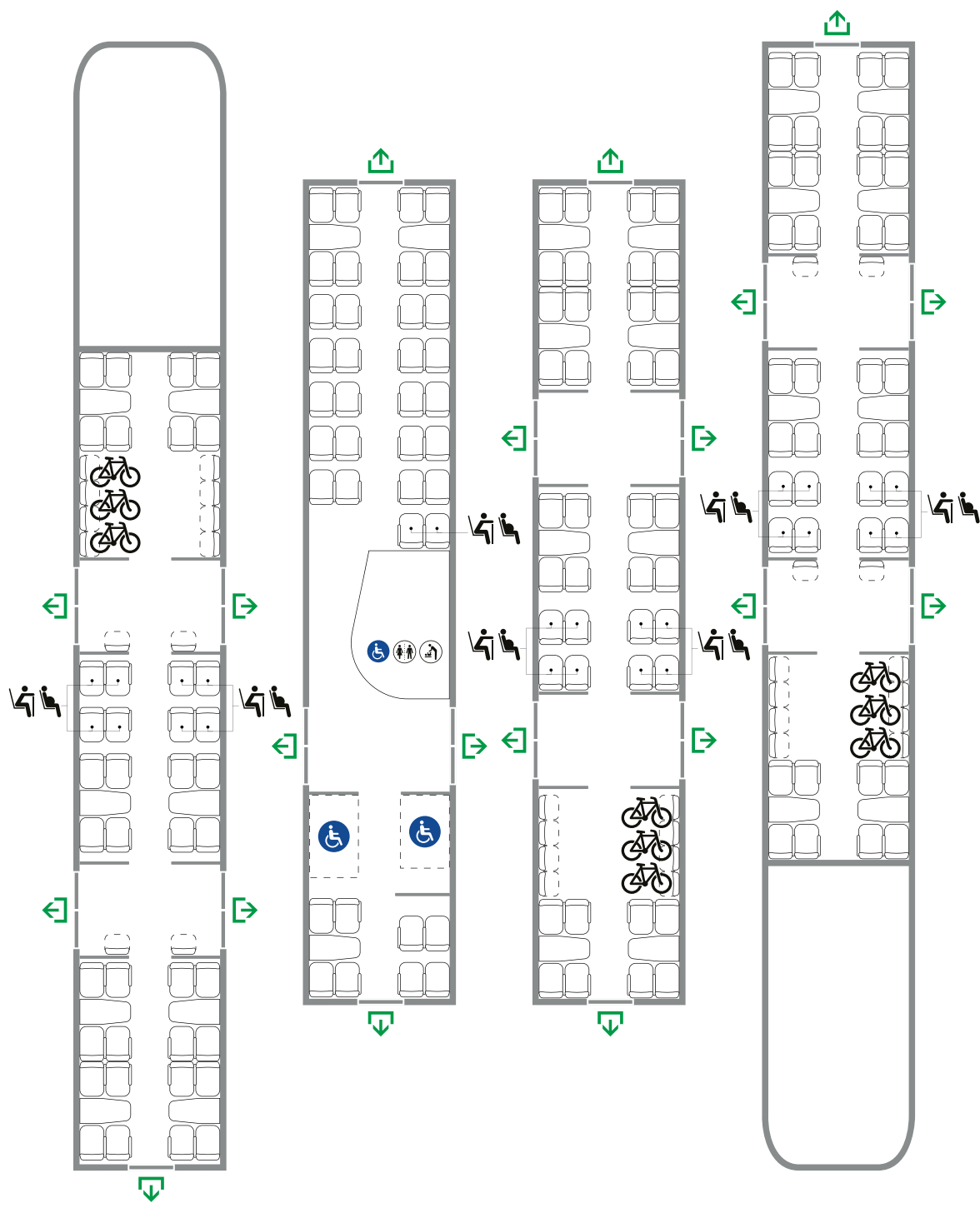

Class 398 Citylink

Built between 2020 and the present, Class 398 Citylinks are three carriage tram-trains using electricity and battery.

Roll out will start in 2026* and once completed we will have 36 of these brand new tram-trains in our fleet.

Please note that there are no toilets on board. Toilet facilities will be available at stations along the route, with a maximum of 20 minute intervals between stops.

* The 398s started to roll out in June 2026 on the direct Pontypridd to Cardiff Bay services. Toilets are available at Pontypridd, Treforest, Radyr and Cardiff Queen Street stations on this route.

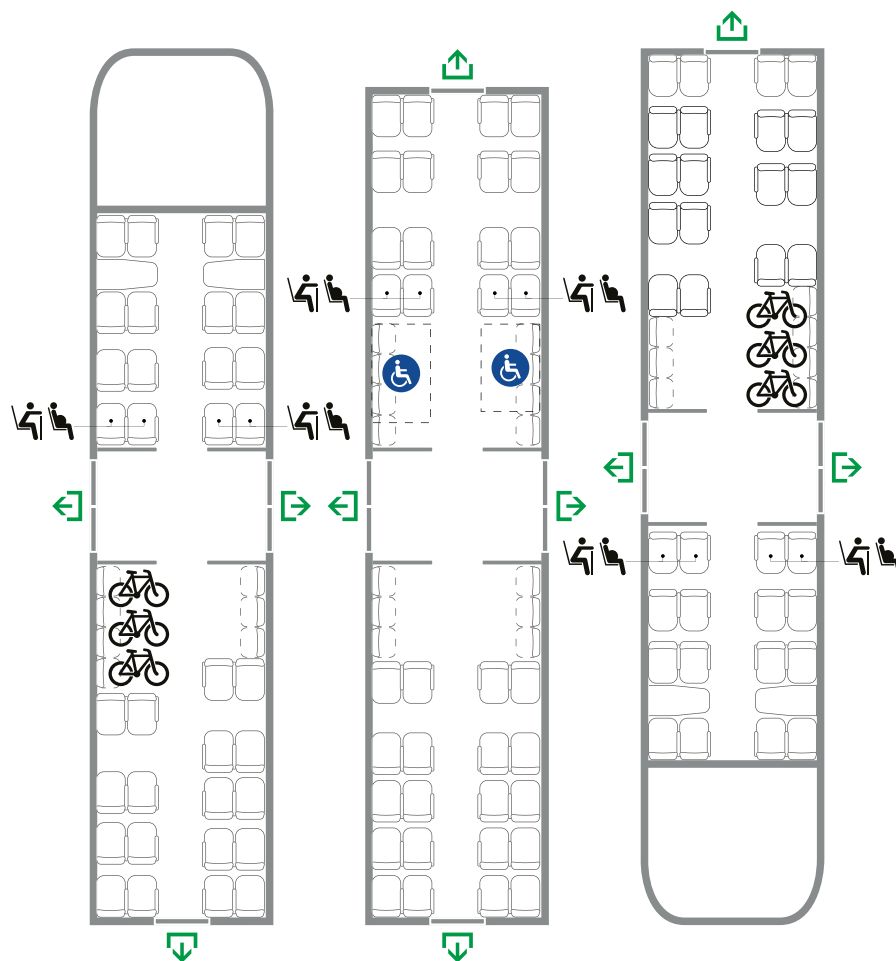
These are the most common routes where you'll find Class 398 Citylink trains, following the launch in Spring 2026.
